The FVD Residents' Benevolent Fund is one of four FVD Charitable Giving Funds and was created as a permanent fund, allowing for only the interest income to be spent. The principal balance will stay in perpetuity. By functioning in this special way, the Residents' Benevolent Fund will exist as long as Friendship Village endures. The primary use for this fund is to provide revenue to offset the cost for LifeCare residents who have outlived their personal financial means.

For obvious reasons, the names of the individuals who need the FVD Residents' Benevolent Fund are held in strictest confidence. But when a Life-care resident has run out of his or her own funding (through no fault of their own), Friendship Village of Dublin provides the resulting necessary support.
